1.) Intravenous fluids provide support to the heart, lungs, and kidneys during anesthesia. An intravenous catheter is inserted into your pet's vein to provide access for the fluids to be given and to administer life saving drugs in the case of an emergency. The cost for this procedure is \$67.16, unless quoted otherwise.

2.) Many of the drugs used in anesthesia are removed from the body by the liver and kidneys. It is important to know how these organs are working before administering any drugs. Since organ function is negatively affected by age, older pets will require more extensive testing.
